<b>CALL TO ORDER</b>	Chairman Dan Marshall called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.
<b>MINUTES</b>	A motion to approve the February 8, 2021 meeting minutes was made by Supervisor Norm Teed seconded by Supervisor Fred Wille. The motion carried.
<b>PUBLIC HEALTH</b>	
a. <b>Resolution:</b> <i>Professional Services Contract with Danielle Martin – 2021</i>	<p>Mary Beer presented a resolution to contract with Danielle Martin for services in the Children with Special Needs Program.</p> <p>Supervisor Fred Wille motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Norm Teed. The motion carried.</p>
b. <b>Resolution:</b> <i>Authorization to Renew Contract Ontario County Humane Society – Rabies Response Program – 2021</i>	<p>Ms. Beer presented a resolution to contract with the Ontario County Humane Society for the Rabies Response Program in the amount of \$109,117.00. She noted this is established in the budget.</p> <p>Supervisor Tammie Hicks motioned to approve the resolution for Rabies Response, seconded by Supervisor Daryl Marshall. The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Beer presented a resolution to accept the Ontario County Public</p>

<p>c. <b>Resolution:</b> Adoption of the Ontario County Public Health Emergency Plan</p> <p>d. <b>Performance Management</b></p> <p>e. <b>Updates</b></p>	<p>Health Emergency Plan.</p> <p>Supervisor Norm Teed motioned to approve the resolution to accept the Emergency Plan, seconded by Supervisor Tammie Hicks. The motion carried.</p> <p>There were no Performance Management updates.</p> <p>Public Health Director Mary Beer gave an update of the COVID-19 Pandemic, noting the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A total of 5,784 residents diagnosed since the onset.</li> <li>• They are two weeks away from the anniversary of the very first case in the County.</li> <li>• They will be having two clinics this week.</li> <li>• Supervisor Daryl Marshall inquired on the vaccinations for Veterans. Jeremy Marshall explained through the VA Healthcare, anyone 65 and older are being set up for appointments.</li> <li>• Irene Coveney noted they are assisting registering those over 65.</li> </ul>
<p><b>MENTAL HEALTH</b></p>	
	<p>Director of Mental Health Jessica Mitchell gave an update on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• She received a letter from the Office of Mental Health, letting them know that the state was going to refund portions of withholds from 4/1/2020 through 2/23/2021.</li> <li>• They have not seen anything come through on OASIS.</li> <li>• She received news that the grant for Finger Lakes, Monroe, and S2ay regional collaborative grant in response to the opioid epidemic with a piece of prevention work as well as treatment recovery services. They were awarded \$500,000 across the different counties.</li> </ul>
<p><b>OFFICE FOR THE AGING</b></p>	
<p>a. <b>Resolution:</b> Authorization to Contract with homemakers of the Genesee, dba, Caregivers – OFA – 2021</p> <p>b. <b>Resolution:</b> Authorization to Contract with Ontario ARC for Exercise and Nutrition Classes – OFA – 2021-2022</p> <p>c. <b>Resolution:</b> Authorization to Contract with PurFoods LLC dba Mom’s Meals – OFA 2021-2022</p> <p>d. <b>Informational:</b> Advocacy Binder</p>	<p>Irene Coveney presented three resolutions; the first to contract with Caregivers for personal care services at a rate of \$25 per hour, the second is with Ontario ARC for nutrition and exercise classes, and the third is with Mom’s Meals for delivery of meals.</p> <p>Supervisor Fred Wille motioned to approve the three resolutions as a block, seconded by Supervisor Norm Teed. The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Coveney noted that the state agency which she is on the board has been doing intensified advocacy the last few years. Most of their funding for their services have been stagnant for nearly 20 years. They</p>

e. <i>Updates</i>	<p>have had some success with the funding and want to continue their advocacy. She pointed out something called the longevity economy. The Advocacy Binder goes out to all the legislators.</p> <p>Ms. Coveny reported that her and her staff have worked very hard taking calls for hundreds of seniors who have had a difficult time registering for the vaccine clinics.</p>
<b>DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES</b>	
a. <i>Updates</i>	<p>Eileen Tiberio gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In October they received a \$460,000 from emergency solutions grant which is HUD money to forestall addictions and to help people who are homeless get into housing. They originally delegated that money to FLACRA, who is subcontracting with Law NY, Catholic Charities and Family Promise. They have now been notified of their second allocation of \$460,000 but the have included the code blue funding into that. Due to the rules of “HUD” money, the eviction for someone must be imminent, but because of the moratorium, they have not been able to expend much of the dollars. Ms. Tiberio noted every county is experiencing this.</li> <li>• The Governor’s proposed budget proposes a mandated Family Assessment Response in the child protective arena. Family Assessment Response (FAR) up to this point has been optional program. Ms. Tiberio does not support the mandate and is working with the Public Welfare Association to push back to leave this program as an option.</li> </ul>
<b>YOUTH BUREAU</b>	
	<p>Marsha Foote reported the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The 2021 proposed budget with Safe Harbors has been approved.</li> <li>• Ms. Foote proposed with Seneca and Yates County to do a tri-county human trafficking summit in June. They are working with the Child Advocacy Center and Safe Harbors of the Finger Lakes</li> <li>• For Youth Development, OCFS, instead of holding 20%, they are only holding 5%.</li> <li>• She sent letters to the school and communities for the nominations of various awards. They will not be doing a large event this year.</li> </ul>

<b>VETERANS SERVICE AGENCY</b>	
	<p>Jeremy Marshall reported the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• With the COVID-19 Vaccine, the veterans need to be eligible for VA Health Care for the VA to administer the vaccine. They are willing to assist with any veteran that is not already enrolled in the health care.</li> <li>• Jeremy Marshall’s Department has partnered with Chapter 19-7of the Combat Veteran’s Motorcycle Association to get</li> </ul>

	donations in a donation drive for the Homeless Prevention Program with the Veteran Outreach Center.
<b>COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR</b>	
	<p>County Administrator Chris DeBolt gave an update on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Operational updates of the County noting one person reported positive last week.</li> <li>• He has been working with the schools, putting a press release out asking patience with the parents noting the Public Health has not been given the lateral to make the decision to open schools.</li> <li>• The local Health Department must report to DOH the number of staff at each PreK through 12 have been vaccinated. The school is working with Public Health to assist with the numbers.</li> <li>• No change to the Governor's travel guidance but to expect large changes soon.</li> <li>• There are new guidance's coming out for activities and weddings. A location for rapid testing will be needed.</li> </ul>
