	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 105 total deaths • They are number one in the region for the percent of adults who have received vaccines, and the Ontario County Public Health have held over 39 clinics. • The school guidance came out from the state to reflect the CDC guidance.

a. <i>Updates</i>	<p>Jessica Mitchell gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They are interviewing for a contract psychiatric time; they have lost a couple of their contract psychiatric time. • The mental health clinic is struggling because they have people going out on disability. • They are seeing an increase in mental health problems in the general community. • The types of cases are getting much more complex. • They are working with Public Health to get something scheduled specific to their mental health population for clinics.

The NYS Office for the Aging had highlighted them. They are a go between Uber and Lyft, so they will be arranging the rides for the clients and for their office. The motion carried Ms. Coveny gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A year ago, they collaborated on a grant proposal with Lifespan for a mobility manager. They will have a part time mobility manager that will sit in their New York Connect program and be able to help people of all ages connect with transportation services. • In the NYS Budget, \$8MM additional dollars was allocated to Offices for the Aging; with the money they may receive, she is hopeful to get another staff person in her office. • They are reopening in May, their three of their congregate sites for in person dining. • Their office will begin doing home visits again. • Their staff will be back in the office in May.
DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES	
a. <i>Updates</i>	<p>Eileen Tiberio gave the following updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The NYS Budget; most of what they were looking at in terms of cuts were restored. • With the Treasury money that was coming to assist with the eviction prevention; they must develop a plan, but the eligibility will be done by state employees. Ms. Tiberio continued to explain some of the steps that will be involved to apply for the money.
