CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order at 11:00 am by Chairman Green. A quorum was present.

MINUTES

Supervisor Bendzlowicz made a motion to approve the minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting from May 1, 2019. Supervisor Menikotz seconded the motion. Motion carried.

CAMPBELL COMMISSION

Update

Supervisor Campbell noted that he gave an update at the last Board of Supervisors Meeting and have nothing additional to report. The next Campbell Commission meeting is scheduled for June 6th and will discuss cashless bail and Criminal Justice reform.

PUBLIC WORKS/SHERIFF

Informational: Graphics for Patrol Cars

Sheriff Henderson shared that the current logo for the Sheriff has been around since 1993. They are looking into a new logo for the vehicles. Sheriff Henderson passed around a graphic of the new logo design they are considering.

Informational: Sheriff's Vehicles

Bill Wright presented a hand out of the Sheriff's vehicle replacement plans for 2019-2022. He reviewed the criteria they use for the analysis. He noted the availability of cars are becoming more limited

in the make of the vehicle.

Supervisor Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the payment, seconded by Supervisor Sauers. Motion carried.

PROBATION:

Resolution: Cayuga Centers for Functional Family Therapy Services for the Probation Department

Amy Stoyles presented six resolutions listed under PROBATION for services that are contracted for Raise the Age law. She noted a Whereas clause was added to the resolutions for Glove House, Centers for Dispute Settlement, Youth Advocacy and the OC Youth Program to reflect that the Public Safety Committee has reviewed and recommends approval of the contracts.

Resolution: Authorization to Enter in Agreement with Cayuga Centers for Multi-Systemic Therapy Services for the Probation Department

Supervisor Menikotz, noted under the resolution for the Youth Advocacy program, there is a Whereas that says it plans to use the therapeutic respite homes, but Supervisor Menikotz noted it should apply to the youth advocacy program.

Resolution: Center for dispute Settlement for Juvenile Justice Restorative Conferences for the Probation Department

Brian Young stated as an amendment it should read, "Whereas the Probation Department will use this program for Raise the Age Youth".

Resolution: Glove House for Therapeutic Respite Homes for the Probation Department

Supervisor Campbell motioned to approve as a block the six resolutions presented with the amendment to the Youth Advocacy resolution. Supervisor Guard seconded the motion.

Resolution: Youth Advocacy Program for the Probation Department

Discussion: Supervisor Campbell requested clarification on whether these resolutions were reimbursable by the state. Mary Krause confirmed that these particular resolutions will be reimbursed. However, she noted that with the budget, not all Raise the Age positions have been approved for reimbursement. A brief discussion took place concerning on what will be reimbursed as well as the rate for the therapeutic respite homes.

Resolution: Partnership for Ontario County for Youth Court Program for the Probation Department

Motion carried.

OFFICE OF SHERIFF

Resolution: Authorization to Accept Donation for Safe Child ID Program – Eagle Lodge

Sheriff Henderson presented six resolutions under OFFICE OF SHERIFF for approval.

Supervisor Bendzlowicz motioned to approve as a block the six resolutions presented. Supervisor Campbell seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Informational: SLETPP Grant Application 2019

Sheriff Henderson reported they have applied for a grant and are looking to purchase sonar equipment.

Chairman Green opened up the topic for Sheriff Henderson regarding a safe zone. Sheriff Henderson stated they would like to have a community drop zone. They do not want to use the term safe zone so as not to give the wrong impression of what the zone area is for. The idea is to have three parking spaces designated at the 3045 County Complex Drive for transactions such as child exchange under court order or purchases made through e-commerce. This designated area would have cameras and is near a facility with officers already monitoring the entrances to the jail. The liability concerns are almost in its finalization stage. They also will be working with Public Works for the striping of the areas. Sheriff Henderson noted that they have had positive responses from the public for this idea. It is also doable with the budget. Sheriff Henderson would like to have PR when this is done. Chairman Green suggested the idea of a panic button available similar to a blue light zone at college campuses.

Update: Jail Population

Sheriff Henderson reviewed the Jail population.

- Current – 142
- Weekend High - 151
- Females - 31
- One minor is housed out.
- Sixteen parole violations without additional charges.

Since the last report; 1,352.25 hours of OT; noting that a portion of that is from staff currently undergoing Range Qualifications.

Current vacancies:

- Five FT Correction Officers
- Eight PT Correction Officers

Sheriff Henderson stated they applied for an additional canine unit under the Homeland Security Grant. It is a fully funded grant for the dog and equipment. They would like to add another nitrate dual

purpose dog to the canine division. Tracking nitrate or bomb detection.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

Updates

Mary Krause reported the following updates:

- Citizens Academy graduation was on May 21st, with 25 plus citizens becoming ambassadors for Ontario County. Chair Green was present. She shared some testimonials the participants wrote.
- The Conflict Defender recruitment committee will meet in the beginning of June.
- Town Supervisor's if interested in the shared services to store records/documents with the County by expanding the OnBase program to contact her. OnBase is the electronic document management system.
