CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Dan Marshall called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

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| <p><i>a. Resolution: Authorization to Amend Resolution No. 533-2020 – COVID-19 Epidemiology & Laboratory Capacity Building for Case Investigations and Contact Tracing Coordination Grant – Public Health</i></p> | <p>Mary Beer presented a resolution to amend and extend the contract (6459-01) with HRI.</p> <p>Supervisor Russell motioned, seconded by Teed to approve the resolution. The motion carried.</p> |
| <p><i>b. Informational: Opioid Trends</i></p> | <p>Public Health Director, Mary Beer, let the committee know that that opioid overdoses went up in 2020 and they are continuing to be up in the 1st quarter of 2021. There has also been two overdoses from cocaine this year and Narcan doesn't work on overdoses from cocaine.</p> |

Performance Management:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>2020 Third and Fourth Quarter Reports</i> | <p>Public Health Director, Mary Beer, talked about the performance reports. There isn't a lot to report due to most of the staff working on COVID related tasks. Now that the numbers are down, staff is getting back to their pre-COVID assignments.</p> |

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>2021 First Quarter Report</i> <p>d. <i>Updates</i></p>	<p>Supervisor Hicks motioned to approve the quality reports as presented. Supervisor Russell seconded the motion. The motion carried.</p> <p>Public Health Director, Mary Beer, informed everyone that they are only seeing a sprinkling of COVID cases at this time, with a lot of days that have no new cases. They have added 4 new deaths to the COVID report. They were found from death certificate reporting. Ms. Beer also asked the committee about their thoughts of adding smoking of marijuana and vaping to the no smoking county policy. Discussion ensued and the committee asked Ms. Beer to gather more information, work with the County Administrator and County Attorney’s office, and present options back to committee next cycle.</p>

<p>a. <i>Updates</i></p>	<p>Mental Health Director, Jessica Mitchell, had no updates for the committee.</p>
<p>OFFICE FOR THE AGING</p>	
<p>a. Resolution: <i>Amendment to Resolution 176-2021 – GoGo Grandparent Contract 2021-2022</i></p> <p>b. <i>Updates</i></p>	<p>Office for the Aging Director, Irene Coveny, presented a resolution to amend the GoGo Grandparent Contract. This amendment will allow for a 15% tip to be added for the driver.</p> <p>Supervisor Wille motioned, seconded by Supervisor Daryl Marshall to approve the resolution. The motion carried.</p> <p>Office for the Aging Director, Irene Coveny, let the committee know that there is still a shortage in home care workers for personal care services. They currently have about 40 people on a waiting list. Salaries must be increased to decrease these shortages throughout the State. Medicaid and Medicare reimbursement rates are part of what keeps salaries for these position at the current rate. They also don’t get reimbursed for milage for their travel between clients. People are also making more money working at a fast-food establishment, so they are taking those jobs.</p>

<p>a. Informational: <i>New DSS Contracts</i></p> <p>b. <i>Updates</i></p>	<p>DSS Commissioner, Eileen Tiberio, provided information regarding new DSS contracts. No committee members had any questions on the contracts.</p> <p>DSS Commissioner, Eileen Tiberio, talked about new legislation that provides a new option for foster children that have aged out. They are now able to request to come back to the program to prevent them from being homeless. Also, the State is allowing anyone that wants to waive the face to face interview for benefits to request a different way for the interview to be provided, such as WebEx or phone. They are still waiting on more guidance from the State for this option. Ms. Tiberio also passed out a paper providing a breakdown of where the application have been completed at the State level for the Emergency Rental Assistance funds throughout the State.</p>
