“Howard L. Kirk, 65, Retired from Kodak, Dies of Heart Attack.” *Rochester Democrat & Chronicle*. Sep. 4, 1960. p. 15 (8B). The article indicates that Kirk was born in Oskaloosa, IA and had been a principal in several schools, including one in Irondequoit. It mentions his service

in World War I. He died at Ft. Dix, NJ while returning from a visit to a nephew serving in the Air Force in Europe. He had worked for Kodak from 1942-1960. The article does not mention burial in Canadice Corners.
