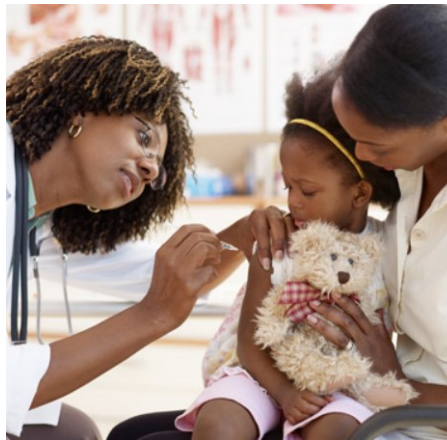


Vaccines continue to be named among the top ten achievements of public health. Vaccines reduce disease burden, hospitalization, and healthcare costs associated with vaccine preventable disease.

Ontario County Public Health works with schools, daycares, migrant programs and the jail population to be sure that all residents of Ontario county have an equal opportunity to be vaccinated. Immunizations clinics are offered to county residents on a weekly basis at the Ontario County Public Health Immunization Clinic.

Vaccines for Children

Ontario County Public Health offers 17 different childhood vaccines to children under the age of 19 years through participation in the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. The VFC program is a federal program established to provide vaccines to uninsured or under insured children. Children with Medicaid insurance are often serviced by the VFC program ensuring that our most vulnerable population is fully immunized.

Vaccines for Adults

Many adult vaccines are now available to uninsured and underinsured populations through a state supported program called Vaccines for Adults (VFA). Twice a month vaccines clinics are held at the Ontario County Jail. This program encourages the vaccination against Hepatitis A and B as this population is at a higher risk for both disease. Several types of vaccines are available to service the migrant and seasonal farm worker populations. Finally, MMR vaccine is available to residents going to college. As Public Health Law in NYS requires these students to have proof of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella.
